e have received good news from our partners, Trans World Radio (TWR) Canada. As you know, they are producing Bible Stories Alive (BSA) in Mandarin, Arabic, Persian, Spanish, Swahili, Somali, and Hindi.

Recently, TWR Canada distributed to the Mandarin-speaking community USBs (data storage devices smaller than your thumb) containing almost 200 Old Testament stories – in e-book format so the children can enjoy the pictures as they listen to the story.

Responses have started to come in. Here are a few quotes.

"This kind of storytelling is very helpful for me! Using simple words to explain the Bible to the children and using lively voices is really engaging. Thank you, brothers and sisters, for your labour and may God bless you all."

he broadcast for July 24th, 2021 will be the 2500th consecutive airing of A Visit with Mrs. G since the first airing on September 2nd, 1973.

The ministry was started by TWR US when one of their leaders "accidentally" heard Mrs. G tell a story and recognized her talent.

Mrs. G was amazed when TWR invited her to broadcast stories on a new story program. And she was still more amazed when God graciously blessed the Bible stories so that the program grew like a mustard seed the smallest of seeds – into a tree (Matthew 13:31-32).

Our multi-lingual ministry began 20 years ago when TWR Cambodia asked for permission to produce and broadcast Bibles Stories Alive in Khmer. This was followed by a request by TWR Nepal, and these broadcasts continue to this day.

Our present multi-lingual project started in 2013 at the invitation of TWR Canada. It now involves eight languages, and this may not be the end.

The opportunity to reach other countries and lan-

guage groups in partnership with TWR are almost limitless, if the Lord so wills. TWR Canada engages with local ministries, partners, and missionaries in 60 countries (in over 70 languages). TWR Canada emphasizes engagement in projects where media complements local ministry, and they are able to work in all parts of Africa, South and Northeast Asia, the Caribbean, Central and East Europe, the Middle East, South America and even here at home, primarily in the province of Quebec.

Our **Spanish** program is now available to the TWR Latin America FM Network. Forty stations across 10 countries have downloaded the program. The countries include Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Columbia, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Peru, Spain, and the US. We look forward to response letters from listeners. One book has already been published in Spanish.

We now have 17 books translated and produced in audio in Arabic, and the number of streams and downloads have increased by 15 times in the last two years.
