A New Kind of Radio Program for Children

his is a picture of children in a radio studio in Nairobi, Kenya. They are listening to a Bible Stories Alive (BSA) program in Swahili. Then they will answer questions and give their thoughts about the story. And children listening at home will phone in with their answers and comments.

It's fun – it's an exciting way of finding out the message of a Bible story.

This new radio program is called Hadith hai za Bibilia – that is Swahili for Bible Stories Alive.

The broadcast started six months ago and Trans World Radio (TWR) Kenya has sent us some of the comments of listeners.

"We have started a new family 'tradition'," one girl says. "We listen to the program

together as a family on Saturday morning at breakfast time and then we discuss what we have learned. Our parents and all of us children are now actively involved in learning about God through the Bible stories."

Parents are listening with their children. A mother says: "After the program my ten-year-old daughter and I go over the Bible story together and discuss any questions she has."

Siblings are learning together. A thirteen-year-old listens with her younger sister and says, "We are being encouraged to learn more about the Word of God."

Children from other religious backgrounds love the stories too. A nine-year-old girl of a Muslim background tuned in to hear BSA for three consecutive Saturdays. Then she called in live and asked if she could come to the studio to learn more about the Bible.

Her Muslim parents brought her the next Saturday, and she has joined the other children on air. She has become an active participant on the show and answers many of the questions.



A six-year-old girl enjoys the program every Saturday and shares the lessons with her Sunday school class the next day! "I enjoy the lessons so much," she says, "especially the lessons on *Adam and Eve*."

The response report we received from TWR Kenya included another cause for praise. Because of the Swahili BSA broadcasts, listeners are asking the Kenya BSA team to come to their village and to their school to teach their children God's Word.

Please pray for the Lord's provision as we and the TWR teams edit and translate and produce the programs for the Swahili broadcasts and for the broadcasts in other languages. The Lord answers prayer!

Updates

n the 40th anniversary of A Visit with Mrs. G, our ministry decided to expand Bible Stories Alive (BSA) into other languages in response to outside requests. Mrs. G expressed the desire to have her stories edited and adapted for this purpose. This is the work in which we are now engaged in our office – producing "translation versions." We have finished 17 books and are now working on Mrs. G's stories from the Book of Joshua. Recently our team completed *Moses and the Great Encounter* as well as *Gideon* and *Jonah*.

In Partnership with TWR Canada

Mandarin. Thirteen books have been translated and have begun to be used in some Sunday schools in China.

Arabic. The translator is currently translating the 10th book. Six audio recordings have been produced thus far.

Swahili. The team has translated 5 books. They have recorded 4 books for radio broadcast.

Persian. Seven books have been translated, and six have been produced.

Spanish. The translator is currently translating the 6th book, and recording of the 2nd book is now being done.

Parents who listened when they were children are excited to share Mrs. G's stories with their own children.
